The evening will end at 10:00 p.m. with a fireworks display at Pumpkin Park sponsored by Ohio Valley and Putnam County Banks. I hope to see you there!

There is a lot going on this summer. Two of our projects I have been talking about for a while—new water tank and smart meters. Let me remind the Smart Meters are smart. Your bill may decrease or it may increase but it will be more accurate and show the exact, actual water usage. They catch everything, even the smallest drip which will save you money if you have a leak. Both will start in June and be completed by Fall 2016.



I'm sure you have noticed we are paving some streets and I'm sure you noticed whether or not it is your street. We need your patience, we cannot do them all at once. Almost all of streets need paved but it is very expensive. This is the first year for our Municipal Sales Tax and we dedicated most of those funds to street paving and sidewalks. Some streets we only paved the bad sections and I know it doesn't look the best but it sure a whole lot smoother. In the future we may be able to do the whole street but for now our goal is to take care of the worst sections. So far we have completed some sort of paving on Shaw, Stewart, Mockingbird, Compton, 2nd Street, Hillview, Sunset, Pike, Pinehaven, Washington, Adams, Mason and Summers Addition. Did you know we have 81 streets or alleys totaling 14.2 miles in the City limits?



We have some other beautification projects planned that we hope to complete this summer. There are several areas we plan to build flower beds as well as add some down Main Street. It is always nice to spruce things up and make the City more appealing. Speaking of sprucing up I want to thank the Apostolic Church for all they have done. It never hurts as a business owner to stop and take a close look at your store front as a first time visitor would. Sometimes all it needs are the windows cleaned or a fresh coat of paint. The sprucing up applies to home owners also. There is always something we can do to our property to make it more appealing.

From the Recorder Phyllis Smith

I want to wish you a Happy, safe, 4th of July and let me invite you to stop by our celebration in the park beginning at noon on July 4. Please use caution around young children as you celebrate.

Our new fiscal year begins July 1, 2016. We are beginning to see the effects of the Municipal Sales Tax on our budget which has allowed us to pave some streets. Also, you need to be sure you and/or your accountant are using the new B & O Form with the reduced rates. These are available on our website.

A reminder to renew your City Business License, Contractor License and any other required license for your business, and yes this includes rental property. If you haven't done so please take care of this immediately. Your 2nd Quarter B & O Taxes are due by August 15 to avoid penalties.

From the Building Inspector/Code Enforcer Josh Jackson

The summer weather we were all longing for this past winter has come in full force. In this edition of the *Miltonian* I would like to talk about some things you can do to help stay cool and safe this summer.

That usually starts with some type of air conditioning system. Whether it be window units or heat pumps some of the tips remain the same. To keep everything running in top condition routine and preventative maintenance is key. Be sure to clean and check your filters. Hopefully you have already had your unit serviced prior to ready this because repairmen are often busy this time of the year. If you have an outdoor unit it is very important to keep the immediate area around the unit free from shrubbery, grass and any other obstruction.



Take advantage of the warm weather and wash the outside of your windows and clean the siding. While it might be tempting to use a pressure washer, a garden hose is best to avoid potentially damaging the exterior of your home. Apply a coat of fresh paint if needed, and repair any damaged vinyl or aluminum siding. Most of these routine projects do not require any type of permitting. As always anyone you hire or contract to do any type of work, even that which does not require permits, that person needs to have a license with the City of Milton as well as the proper licensing with the State of West Virginia. It is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure that whoever you hire is indeed licensed and properly insured. You can always contact me at City Hall and I would be happy to assist you with verifying this.



Lastly, something that tends to get overlooked is driveways and walkways. Inspect the pavement for cracks and holes, and remedy them. This goes a long way in preventing accidental slips, trips, and falls. It also helps to avoid larger repairs or resurfacing in the future. If you see weeds popping up between cracks in the pavement you should resist the urge to pull them up. You'll only remove the upper part of the weed, but the root system will remain intact and new growth will return within a few weeks. For a cost-effective solution, boil water in a kettle, carefully carry the kettle outside, and pour the water on any weeds to kill them for the season.



Also, now that summer is here let me remind you that the City does have ordinances regarding lawn care, rubbish, junk on porches and other issues that can be considered a health hazard. We ask that you take a look at and around your property to see if there is anything you need to take care of.

From the Utilities Department

Office News: We are still getting returned water bills due to incorrect addresses. If you are not receiving a water bill call and verify the address we have on file for your account. The new billing systems requires an address approved by the USPS.

If you are building a new home or need a new meter and/or tap installed for any reason you MUST come in the office 3 WEEKS PRIOR and pay for the tap or meter to start this process. Do not take for granted that your information will get delivered to the office by the workers. They are doing their job which is working in the field, they are not responsible for the office work. In order for a work order to be initiated all the information needs to be entered for proper billing. Please following this procedure to avoid any complications in your service.

Public Works: We want to thank all the pet owners for their cooperation in cleaning up after their pets. We see you with your bags and have noticed the improvement. However there are still problem areas, one being the grassy area between Main Street and Rt. 60 which we maintain. If you use this area please pick up after your pet and dispose of the waste properly. Pet waste on the ground leads to pet waste in our water.

We are encountering another problem that we need to bring to your attention. The workers pick up bagged leaves and grass clippings which are then opened and dumped from the bags for burning. Our burn permit is for vegetation only—please DO NOT put trash or pet waste in your bag of leaves or grass clippings.

Our summer projects are the new water tank and smart meters which should be under way or beginning soon and the beautification phase from previous water and sewer projects such as yard and street repairs. An important reminder to customers please keep access to water meter lids clear of any landscaping.

Stormwater—Why is a storm water person talking about bees? Turns out you can do things to help bees that helps keep harmful chemicals out of storm-water and the plants that provide pollen also keeps more storm-water on site.

Be the solution to help protect bees in crisis. Believe it or not, you have a bee to thank for every one in three bites of food you eat.

Honey bees—wild and domestic—perform about 80 percent of all pollination worldwide. A single bee colony can pollinate 300 million flowers each day.

Grains are primarily pollinated by the wind, but fruits, nuts and vegetables are pollinated by bees. Seventy out of the top 100 human food crops—which supply about 90 percent of the world's nutrition—are pollinated by bees. But bees are in crisis now due to their declining population. Without bees our food prices would skyrocket.



While there are many reasons for the decline here are a couple things you can do to help: (1) Plant flowers that are pollinators. Resources are available online such as West Virginia Pollinator Handbook at <http://www.xerces.org/wp-content/uploads/2009/11/WVPH-SEC.pdf>; (2) Reduce use of insecticides especially ones containing a Neonicotinoid. Call the Cabell County WV Extension Service has more info on non-neonicotinoid insecticides at 304-743-7551.

If constructing or remodeling please run roof gutters/downspouts away from pavement and out to the ground. Rain and snow-melt from rooftops usually soaks into the ground to recharge underground water aquifers. Sending the gutter/downspout drainage into the yard (away from house foundation) allows this natural process to continue. Consider the unnecessary contributions to storm-water overflow when all the neighborhood rooftops empty onto driveways, curbside gutters and down storm drains to nearby creeks. The State requires us to reduce the amount of stormwater entering the Mud River

Please let us know if you notice a clogged or slow draining storm drain. We have a crew that cleans them out on a regular basis but they may become clogged in between cleanings. Please call 743-3032, extension.305 to report.

Floodplain News—If you have plans to build or remodel please check to see if you are in the flood zone. We can check or you can go to <http://www.mapwv.gov/flood/>. In the upper left corner under <views> select expert view which will change the solid red area into a red shaded area which makes it easier to see your property. At the top left-center of the screen is the <search> area. There you can enter your street address to zoom in on your property. For example, for City Hall you would type '1139 Smith St Milton WV'.



Notice for Surveyors and Professional Engineers: FEMA announced June 16 that a fillable version of the 2015 Elevation Certificate (FEMA Form 086-0-33) is available on their website at <https://www.fema.gov/media-library/assets/documents/160>. For insurance purposes, Floodplain Managers will continue to accept properly completed and certified elevation information, in a different format, through Dec. 31, 2016. **After that, all elevation information must be submitted using the FEMA EC.** Note in the future, no further transition periods will be provided when a new FEMA EC is approved. 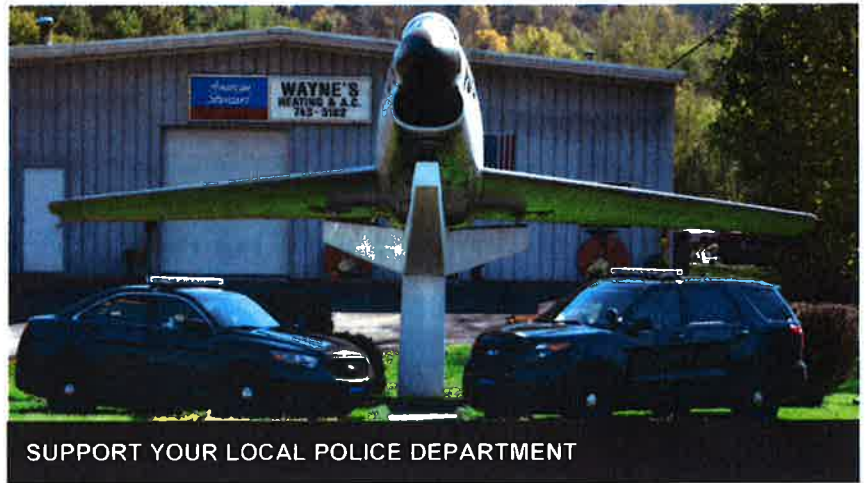
September Festival

Police News from Chief Joe Parsons

Things have been progressing well in the Police Department. We held another Speed Enforcement Blitz on I-64 and while we did not catch anybody driving over 100 mph this time we did catch over a half dozen driving 90 mph or more. All in all we clocked 65 speed violators in less than 3 hours. This was all done in the backstop of our fourth traffic fatality since my tenure as chief began last August. That's a total of four fatal crashes on I-64 in less than a year. This shows the importance of traffic law enforcement as one element of what officers do on a daily basis.

As far as the other elements, Milton Police Department officers have been active in criminal investigations, arresting numerous persons for a variety of charges including shoplifting, auto theft, and larceny and of course drug charges. I continue to be proud of our officers and the job that they are doing. Milton is well protected by some very dedicated young men, and a few old ones.

In my conversations with officers from various agencies in the surrounding area I find that the drug problems that we are faced with are not unique. Everyone is experiencing an epidemic of illegal drug use and the companion crime that comes with it to support their drug habits. I think it would surprise many people to know how many drug related arrests we make on a monthly basis. Along that line, to better inform the public of our efforts, I intend to start placing a weekly police report on our Face book page. This will not start until July so don't be looking for it until then but still check out our page if you have Facebook.

I will be going to full-time status beginning July 1st so you will be able to get ahold of me anytime Monday through Friday on dayshift. I am very much looking forward to returning to law enforcement full time and also to meeting many more citizens of Milton. I've met many good folks over the past year in Milton and I know I've just scratched the surface.

Finally, the Fourth of July holiday is approaching and with the new fireworks laws in effect allowing more powerful items to be purchased I urge you to use caution, supervise your children and have a safe and enjoyable Independence Day.

I hope everyone is enjoying their start to summer. In the last few months a lot of changes have been and will be happening around the fire department. First off I would like to congratulate some members on recent promotions: Robert Legg, Deputy Chief; Greg Rowsey, Assistant Chief; Caleb Starkey, Captain; Anthony Hatfield, Lieutenant; Jonathan Jones, Lieutenant; Travis Ashworth, Sergeant; Andrew Wheeler, Sergeant.

Along with changes of personnel within the department we are beginning to make some changes around the department. The building committee has been working very hard to make cosmetic changes to the building itself. You will notice the changes in the weeks coming. The financial department has also been working on our annual fund drive letter which you will start to notice in the mail. Not only has it been quite busy inside the walls of the department but also with responses to emergencies as well. In the past two months (May and June) the members have responded to 72 requests for service which include fires, auto-accidents, medical, public services and mutual aid calls.

With the heat and warm weather increasing here are some quick, easy tips to prevent a potential injury or illness from occurring:

- Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of fluids. (avoid drinks with caffeine or alcohol)
- Avoid extreme temperature changes

- Make sure pets that are outdoors have plenty of shade and cool water
