

# CITY OF MILTON COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

MARCH 7, 2017

7:00 P.M.

Mayor Canterbury called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The invocation was given by Council Member Adkins and the pledge of allegiance was said in unison.

Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the agenda. Second by Council Member Taylor. Motion carried.

Council Member Conard moved to approve the minutes from the February 7 Council meeting and the February 21 Special meeting. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Recorder Smith read the bills totaling \$108,323.74. Council Member Conard moved to approve the bills. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Chief Parsons asked for Council's approval to obtain Will Basham as the Department's Police Chaplain. Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the Police Chaplain. Seconded by Council Member Taylor. Motion carried.

Recorder Smith read the City Financial Report for January 2017. General Fund: Income \$241,128.83, Expense \$166,631.97, Net \$74,496.86, Checking \$268,014.03, Savings \$396,227.68, Misc. Accounts \$42,898.18, Total Fund \$707,139.89; Cemetery Fund: No Income, Expense \$44.79, Net \$-44.79, Checking \$2,869.33, Savings \$57,302.80, CD's \$30,350.05, Total Fund \$90,522.18; Coal Severance Fund: Income \$1,299.41, No Expenses, Net Income \$1,299.41, Checking \$7,913.29, Total Fund \$7,913.29. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the Financial Report. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

City Attorney Scott McClure informed Council that he reviewed the information from Webb Law Centro regarding a Drug Manufacturer Class Action Lawsuit and recommends the City should take advantage of this. Recorder Smith moved to approve the Class Action Lawsuit. Second by Council Member Harshbarger. Motion carried.

Greg Rowsey, Assistant Fire Chief, read the monthly report for February for the Department. The ISO rating dropped from a 5 to a 4 which is a good thing and should lower insurance for everyone within 5 miles from the station. He also thanked everyone for their thoughts and prayers this past weekend. They are getting together a class for Critical Incident Stress Management System to be able to facilitate themselves.
